

College Board Names 12 Mooney Grads as AP Scholars

Jack Higham Named National AP Scholar

The College Board has honored twelve Mooney students, eleven June graduates and one current student as AP Scholars. The students were honored in three categories based on the level of success that they had on the AP tests.

Students scoring a 3 on three or more AP tests were Shelia Christopher, Mackenzie Compton, James Haddad, Patrick Kelty and Murphy Sharp. They were name AP Scholars.

Six students earned honors as AP Scholars with distinction scoring 3.5 or higher on five or more AP tests. Those honorees included Kristina Aiad-Toss, Lily Appugliese, Devin Joss, Kaitlyn Keffler, Spencer Olesh and Andrew Rossi

Jack Higham, earned the singular honor of being named a National AP Scholar. Requirement for the recognition is based on a score of 4 or more on eight AP tests taken. Higham scored a perfect 5 on all eight AP exams. Higham and Keffler were co-valedictorians of the Class of 2014 and are members of the freshmen Class at the University of Notre Dame. Higham is majoring in chemical engineering and Miss Keffler is majoring in Biology.

AP Tests are administered by the College Board and are taken after students take Advanced Placement classes, those are college level courses offered by high schools and which universities can use to give students credit. According to statistics released by the College Board, 59 percent of test takers earned a 3 and just 14% scored a 5 in an AP test. Higham's scores of eight 5's are phenomenal, vice principal Joanne Carney Smith noted "Higham is the only National AP Scholar in memory at Cardinal Mooney."

> competitors have worked to get the program this far."



PHYSICAL IMPROVEMENTS AND CURRICULUM EXPANSION **GREET STUDENTS FOR FALL CLASSES**



Students returning to Cardinal Mooney this fall found both physical upgrades and expansion of the curriculum. The front entry of the school was renewed with a new handicap accessible ramp and adjoining cement sidewalk around the driveway. The brick wall on the second floor adjacent to the main steps, which was cracked, was removed and replaced. In addition, the sidewalk and steps entering the building from the back parking area was replaced.

Two newly added half credit courses will allow students to improve their technology skills. Students will be introduced to Cloud manufacturing and will continue to develop the school's STEM program. The courses will conform to the standards of the National Additive Manufacturing and Innovation Institute and introduce students to 3-D printing. Veteran teacher Sam Ronshak, who holds three engineering degrees, will teach these courses.

The school's Robotics' team, which was founded last year by physics teacher Ray Marks will be expanded this year to include interscholastic competition. In addition, Cardinal Mooney's computer lab has been relocated and upgraded and preliminary plans are being made to provide teachers and students with "distance learning opportunities" with presentations originating "off-site" that will provide professional enrichment for teachers and course enrichment for students.

COMPUTER LAB UPDATED AND EXPANDED


The lab, which has been relocated to the school's Information Center,

features thirty "top of the line" HP ProOne 400 computers. A total of 32 workstations are available for students in the newly created facility. In addition, an 80" Smart TV, which has the



capability of being connected to "the web," streaming videos or being connected to the instructor's computer to serve as a monitor for demonstrations was added to the classroom. Finally, a multi-purpose "all in one" printer-scanner with both black and white or color capabilities is networked to all student computers.

The school's multi-media production class has access to the lab for editing of videos produced by the class. Janet Cadman, Cardinal Mooney's computer instructor, noted the facility is "able to provide more Mooney students an opportunity to take advantage of the best equipment in a state-of-the-art facility."

ATHLETIC TRAINER JOINS STAFF Anthony Pozzuto




