As Students Return to School, \$5 Million Renovation Project at Cardinal Mooney Is Progressing

YOUNGSTOWN, OHIO — A major renovation to the Cardinal Mooney High School building begun earlier this year has made great progress, and incoming freshmen as well as returning students have seen much that is new for the 2015-2016 school year.

The “top-to-bottom” renovations at Mooney, encompassing every major component of the building from roof to floor, are expected to be completed over a three-year period.

Among the renovations that have already taken place are:

- complete roof replacement
- new tile flooring and reflective ceilings
- remodeling of offices and some classrooms
- new, energy-efficient lighting that can be varied according to need
- installation of all-new, energy-efficient windows at the front of the building
- a newly designed facing for the front of the building (partially complete)

Renovations still to come include:

- additional window installation
- cafeteria renovations
- a greatly improved HVAC system

These ambitious new projects were sparked by a generous gift to Cardinal Mooney given last year by two of its distinguished alumni, **Denise DeBartolo York and Eddie DeBartolo, Jr.** Other Mooney alumni, inspired by the gifts from the DeBartolo York and DeBartolo families, have also made additional donations targeted to physical improvements.

“A school building has a big impact on providing students the best environment for learning,” said Father Gerald DeLucia, president of Cardinal Mooney. “**These improvements will help us with our mission of delivering a high-quality Catholic education.**”

National Merit Scholarship Program Recognizes Mooney's Daniel Driscoll

Daniel Driscoll has been named a Commended Student in the 2016 National Merit Scholarship Program. A Letter of Commendation from the school and the National Merit Scholarship Corporation (NMSC), which conducts the program, will be presented by Principal Mark Vollmer to the Mooney senior.



About 34,000 Commended Students throughout the nation are being recognized for their exceptional academic promise. Although they will not continue in the 2016 competition for National Merit Scholarship awards, Commended Students placed among the top five percent of more than 1.5 million students who entered the 2016 competition by taking the 2014 Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT).

"The young men and women being named Commended Students have demonstrated outstanding potential for academic success," commented a spokesperson for NMSC. "These students represent a valuable national resource; recognizing their accomplishments, as well as the key role their schools play in their academic development, is vital to the advancement of educational excellence in our nation. We hope that this recognition will help broaden their educational opportunities and encourage them as they continue their pursuit of academic success."

Cardinal Mooney Students Involved in Leadership of Mahoning Valley Youth

The Leadership Mahoning Valley Youth programs identify high school sophomores and juniors in Mahoning and Trumbull Counties who have demonstrated leadership potential. The goal is to prepare these young people to someday provide the insight and foresight needed to lead the community. The program provides opportunities to practice constructive leadership, committed involvement and responsible participation in the future of the community.

Students complete a four-month program, which includes monthly day-long sessions that focus on issues of concern to the community including healthcare, social services, education, heritage of the Valley, media, the arts, business opportunities and challenges, government, and criminal justice. The program gives students the opportunity to share relevant learning experiences and to develop effective working relationships.

Students from public, parochial and independent schools in the Mahoning Valley are eligible to participate. The participants represent a cross-section of the community in terms of gender, race and neighborhoods.

Five Mooney students have been accepted to the program for this school year. The junior students participating this fall are: Grace Haddad, Kellyn Jamison, Olivia Christopher, Alex Wollet and Andrew Hubert.



Mooney Alumna Is Inspired to Service Abroad

Attending Cardinal Mooney High School taught me what it truly means to serve. After spending my senior year volunteering around the Youngstown community, a passion of service was ignited in my soul. I am so grateful for the Catholic education that opened my mind and heart to others and inspired me to work toward sustainable change — not just at home, but abroad.

For the past two summers I have spent several weeks volunteering in two developing countries as a **GIVE Volunteer**. GIVE, which stands for Growth International Volunteer Excursions, is a multinational volunteer abroad organization that focuses on sustainable community development in marginalized communities by **assisting, educating and empowering the local population**.

Last year I spent a few weeks working in Nicaragua, Central America. This year, my sister Devyn Appugliese and I spent a month in Tanzania and Zanzibar Island, Africa. During our excursion in Tanzania, Devyn and I were lucky enough to have the opportunity to climb Mount Kilimanjaro, the tallest free-standing mountain in the world, which we both successfully summited after four days.

The **core goal of GIVE** is to provide communities with necessary infrastructure to foster sustainable growth. Devyn and I have been directly involved in building two eco-friendly schools out of recycled materials, teaching English, tutoring,

and organizing extracurricular activities for the children of the communities we serve. GIVE remains involved in these communities after volunteers like me have left. GIVE works year-round to provide opportunities for sustainable development by funding teachers to work in the schools we build and by funding doctors to provide medical care in these communities.

This summer, after graduating with a Bachelor of Arts degree in Psychology from **The Ohio State University**, I once again had the privilege to serve. I spent the month of July working as a GIVE Volunteer in several rural communities in Thailand and Laos. My mission was building sustainable, environment-friendly infrastructures and teaching English to the members of the communities we visited.

Over the past couple of years I have come to realize that my purpose in this world is to work in developing areas of need. I know **that I can give back with the gifts I have been blessed with**, which are to teach and fearlessly serve. Children hold a special love in my heart, and I want to devote my life to giving them a brighter future. **Attending Cardinal Mooney and volunteering with GIVE has changed the direction of my life** as I work towards gaining the honor to be accepted into the Peace Corps and accomplish my dream of living and serving others abroad.
