Mooney Mourns Bishop Hughes



Bishop William A. Hughes, retired Bishop of Covington, KY, and founding principal of Cardinal Mooney High School died February 7th at Carmel Manor in Ft. Thomas, KY, where he had resided since 2004. Bishop Hughes was 91.

Bishop Hughes was ordained in 1946 and served ten years in parish work, seven at St. Charles and three at St. Joseph in Massillon. In 1956, Bishop Emmett Walsh chose him to oversee the construc-

tion of a new diocesan high school on the southside to be named after Edward Cardinal Mooney, former pastor of St. Patrick's parish. Bishop Hughes left a lasting impression on the student body that he was to lead. He was the father of the Mooney family always reminding the students that "we are for Cardinal Mooney and against no one." He took pride in the school, its achievements and its students. As principal, he initiated many of the traditions that are an integral part of the school today. Not only did he know every student by name, he knew their parents also. Even though he had left Youngstown to serve in Kentucky, he stayed in touch with the school, returning for reunions and anniversary celebrations. He always demonstrated a keen memory, quick wit, and a lasting love for the school he created.


Bishop Hughes served as bishop of Covington for sixteen years before retiring in 1995. His funeral was held at the Cathedral Basilica, with Metropolitan Archbishop Joseph Kurtz of Louisville as the principal celebrant. Most Rev. Robert N. Lynch, former General Secretary of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops and currently Bishop of the Diocese of St. Petersburg, Florida, gave the homily.

His leadership of the Covington Diocese, under the episcopal motto "To Serve, Not Be Served," was greatly influenced by the directions of the Second Vatican Council, which ended in 1965.

In Kentucky, he established the Diocesan Pro-Life Commission (now the Pro-Life Office), Diocesan Communications Office, the Development Office continued on next page

ANNOUNCEMENT IS EXPECTED BEFORE SUMMER

Last fall, at the request of several alumni and with the approval of the Board of Directors of Cardinal Mooney High School, Bishop George Murry, S.J. a study was initiated to provide planning for Cardinal Mooney's future. The focus of the study was to consider whether a new building to house Cardinal Mooney High School should be constructed in southern Mahoning County or if the school should remain at the Erie St. location with funds invested to upgrade the existing facility. To that end, alumni and their parents, current students and their parents, future parents of the school, and faculty have been the focus of an intensive effort by Catholic School Management, a consulting firm, located in Connecticut.

Fr. Gerald DeLucia, President of Cardinal Mooney High School, has announced that Cardinal Mooney's Board has made a recommendation to Bishop Murry based on studies made by Catholic School Management of Connecticut. A final decision by the Bishop concerning the school's future: whether to update the existing structure or move the school to southern Mahoning is anticipated by the end of the current school year.

(now the Stewardship and Missions Office) which organized the first Diocesan Annual Appeal in 1984; the Cathedral Foundation, the Committee for Continuing Education of Clergy, and the Lay Personnel Pension Plan Administrative Commission, among other initiatives. In 1982, the Covington Diocese joined the Kentucky Council of Churches.

During his tenure, five new parishes and five new missions, most in eastern Kentucky, were established. In northern Kentucky, he re-established Our Savior Parish in Covington as a parish (1981) and created St. Timothy Parish, Union (1989).

In 1982, Bishop Hughes issued a pastoral statement entitled "A Vision of Church," to encourage more active participation of lay people in the Church. The pastoral letter stressed the importance of priests, religious and lay people working together. In 1985, Bishop Hughes issued a second pastoral letter, "Not Lords, But Servants." Its theme was the need for people of the Church to share responsibilities set forth in the Gospels. In 1992, Bishop Hughes, along with Kentucky's other Bishops, issued "Reverence for Life-The Pursuit of Justice."

Bishop Hughes was born in 1921 in Youngstown, Ohio. After preparing for the priesthood at seminaries in Baltimore and Cleveland, he was ordained in 1946. He served as assistant pastor at parishes in the Youngstown Diocese from 1946-1955 and also was a faculty member at two high schools.

"We commend our brother, Bishop William Hughes, to the loving care of our Heavenly Father," said Bishop Roger Foys, current Bishop of the Diocese of Covington. "After having served the Church as a priest for 66 years and a bishop for 38 years, 16 of those years as Bishop of Covington, he has now gone home to God."

Distinguished Alumni Awards To Dr. Kachmer And Dr. Diorio

Cardinal Mooney High School Alumni Association presented its 2013 Distinguished Alumni Awards at a prayer service held on Wednesday, January 30th. The event, which was held in the school auditorium, was followed by a luncheon for the awardees and their guests. This year's recipients were Dr. Mary Lou Kachmer McGregor, a 1979 graduate of Cardinal Mooney and Dr. William S. Diorio, who graduated in 1960.

The Distinguished Alumni Awards are presented annually. The criterion requires that the awardee "demonstrate a continuing concern and dedication for others by embracing the Cardinal Mooney motto of Sanctity, Scholarship, and Discipline."

Dr. Diorio has been involved with Cardinal Mooney High School for fifty-seven years, first as a student, then as an alumnus, a parent, and finally, as a grandparent. He entered Cardinal Mooney

in 1956 from St. Charles Elementary School. A participant in speech and debate and a member of the football and track teams, Dr. Diorio was also involved in student government and dramatics and was an altar server. After graduation in 1960, he did his undergraduate work at John Carroll University in Cleveland Youngstown State University. Dr. Diorio received his professional training at the Ohio College of Podiatric Medicine, earning his doctorate degree in 1968. Dr. Diorio has been in private practice in Poland for forty-four years.

He is certified by the National Board of Podiatry Examiners and the Academy of Ambulatory Foot

and Ankle Surgery. He is affiliated with St. Elizabeth's Hospital Medical Center, Valley Health Network Hospital and the Surgery Center of Canfield. In addition to his private practice, Dr. Diorio was Director of Podiatric Education for The Foot Clinic of Youngstown for twenty years, provided podiatric services to The Ohio State Penitentiary inmates from 1998 to 2003, and to clients of the Community Action Agency of Lisbon for nearly three years.

There have been three driving forces in Dr. Diorio's life: his family, his profession, and Cardinal Mooney High School. He has given generously of "his time, talent and treasure" to benefit his alma mater. He and his wife Charlotte are the parents of seven children, all Mooney graduates: Tina '86, Mary '88, Billy '92, Gina '94, Dominic '95, Cheryl '98 and Patty 2000. His strong faith and Catholic values led him to send his children to Catholic schools. Catholic education is a tradition that has continued in the Diorio family from generation to generation because of the example established by Dr. Diorio and followed by his children. In 2012, his oldest grandchild, Christine, graduated from Cardinal Mooney and his oldest grandson is currently a sophomore at his alma mater.

Dr. Diorio was one of the first members of the Cardinal Mooney Alumni Board when it was established thirty years ago. The framework established by that board still serves the school today providing leadership and direction for a variety of projects to benefit the school. He served repeatedly on both the Cardinal Challenge phonathon and on the Career Day committees. In addition, he has volunteered as team physician for both the football and soccer teams at Cardinal Mooney. He has supported the auction since its inception and regularly can be found at the annual bocce tournament.

In the letter nominating Dr. Diorio for this award, a member of his family noted that "he instilled in us the value of a Catholic education and of living our Catholic faith every day."

Dr. McGregor entered Cardinal Mooney in 1975 from Holy

Family Elementary School. Her list of activities included: class officer, math team, National Honor Society, tennis team, Ski Club, and dramatics. She was inducted into the school's Athletic Hall of Fame in 2000.

Dr. McGregor earned her medical degree at the Northeastern Ohio Medical University in 1985. After interning at Riverside Methodist Hospital in Columbus, she completed an ophthalmology residency at Case-Western Reserve University in Cleveland. She completed a Pediatric Ophthalmology fellowship at Nationwide Children's Hospital in Columbus and another fellowship in London, England. Today, she is a member of the Department of Ophthalmology at Nationwide Children's Hospital in Columbus and a Clinical Assistant Professor of Ophthalmology at The Ohio State University College of Medicine.

Dr. McGregor is the Director of the Ophthalmology residency program at Nationwide Hospital; in 2007, she was elected president of the hospital's medical staff. Throughout her profes-



CAGERS WIN DISTRICT TITLE

Cardinal Mooney's basketball team, under the direction of first year mentor Brian Danilov, won the Division II district title downing the Salem Quakers 61-46. Salem finished 16-7 while the Cards (12-11) advanced to regional play in Canton. Mooney entered the season with a relatively inexperienced team, with only one returning starter.

The championship marked Mooney's first district title in basketball in fifteen years. While his team lacked experience going into the 2012-2013 season, coach Danilov, a veteran coach, had won six consecutive district titles and a state championship as coach of the Campbell Memorial Red Devils.

The decidedly underdog Cardinals won their district semifinal match against the top seeded Poland BullDogs (21-3) 51-33 to advance to the district championship game. The Cardinal's season came to a close in the regional semi-finals when they fell to Warrensville Heights.

Despite the pressures of her professional life, Dr. McGregor has always found time to give generously of her time for her parish and her children's schools. For ten years she was a volunteer for the children's liturgy program at Our Lady of Victory parish. While her children attended Trinity Catholic Elementary School, Dr. McGregor volunteered for fourteen years and co-founded the Legacy of Learning campaign, an annual fund that helps to support improvements to the school. When she wasn't working at the hospital or volunteering in the schools, Mary Lou donated her time as a coach for her three daughters' softball teams. She is the personification the old saying "if something needs to be done, ask a busy person." Time management is one of her greatest talents!

Dr. McGregor is married to Dr. John McGregor, a Clinical Associate Professor in Neurosurgery at The Ohio State University Hospital. They are the parents of four children: Daniel, a graduate of St. Charles Prep in Columbus (where Mary Lou found time to work as a cafeteria volunteer), Molly, Emma, and Maddie.


young professionals who are passionate about what they do and who want to work in the valley to make a difference."
