Mooney Presents Distinguished Alumni Awards

Cardinal Mooney High School Alumni Association presented its 2014 Distinguished Alumni Awards at a prayer service held January 30. The event, which was held in the school auditorium, was followed by a luncheon for the awardees and their guests in the library.

This year's recipients were Mrs. Susan Squillace Sandine, a 1965 graduate of Cardinal Mooney and Dr. Robert Gerberry, who graduated in 1961.

The Distinguished Alumni Awards are presented annually. The criterion requires that the awardee "demonstrate a continuing concern and dedication for others by embracing the Cardinal Mooney motto of Sanctity, Scholarship, and Discipline."

Mrs. Sandine is charter member of the board of the Cardinal Mooney Alumni Association. She joined the board at its inception in 1987 and has served continuously for 26 consecutive years, currently serving as the board secretary. Mrs. Sandine attended Youngstown State University majoring in elementary education and taught.

MARKETING CAMPAIGN IS TWO-WAY WINNER

There are some players on our football team that are asked to go both ways — that is, start on both offense and defense.

They have two goals: score more, and stop the other side from scoring.

Last August, Cardinal Mooney president Fr. Gerald DeLucia initiated a marketing campaign that needed to go both ways.

The first goal was to "score more" by increasing enrollment at Cardinal Mooney, which had dropped the previous year. Declining enrollment is always a challenge for private high schools. The incoming freshman class was the smallest the school had seen in recent years.

The second goal of the marketing campaign was to reinforce the morale of the faculty, parents and students. Recent discussion concerning building a new school or remodeling the existing one had led to confusion concerning the school's future.

The campaign sought to assure all that the future of the school was secure and while options have been under study for nearly two years, the school will continue offering quality Catholic education to its' students.

Fr. DeLucia believes the temporary drop in enrollment — combined with

Mooney Duo Takes Top State Speech Title

For the 40th consecutive year, Cardinal Mooney's speech team placed in the top ten schools in the state in the Ohio High School Speech League tournament. The tournament was held at Wooster High School in March. The Mooney team, directed by Jennifer Gonda '05, placed fifth in the state followed by Austintown Fitch (6th) and Canfield (9th).

Mooney's Duo Interpretation team of Jennifer Rondinelli and Johnny D'Andrea, both juniors, won the state championship

with their interpretation of "The Boy Who Fell Into a Book." They are coached by Mark Warchol, a 2010 Mooney grad. Sophomore Frank Vennetti placed second in Oratorical Interpretation using Josh Gad's "The Punch Line." Melissa Eperjesi, a four-time state qualifier, placed fourth in Domestic Extemporaneous responding to the question "Would a Republican-run Senate be able to agree with House Republicans on an agenda?"

Sophomore Allison Christopher placed sixth in International Extemporaneous analyzing the question "Should Indonesia limit the influence of Islamism in the government?"

Two students were state semi-finalists. Elise Jamison, a junior, competed in Original Oratory. Her speech, entitled "Affirmative Addiction," will now be published in the OHSSL Manual and can be used for Oratorical Interpretation speakers in the future. Sophomore Gino Ginnetti placed 7th in Drama.

Mooney's quarterfinalists included Michael Eggiman in Drama, Natalie Kunce in Humor, and Haley Mitchell in Oratorical Interp.

In 1987, Dr. Gerberry was elected as the first president of the Cardinal Mooney Alumni Association. In that role, he helped to frame an organization that for more than 25 years has played a critical role in supporting his alma mater.

Dr. Gerberry's leadership was critical in the creation of the Cardinal Challenge, the school's annual fund campaign. He was active in the creation of the Cardinal Mooney and Ursuline auction. He and his family are members of St. Charles Parish, where he has served on parish council and as a lector and lay distributor. In addition, he is also active in the St. Vincent dePaul Society.

He was recognized as the Outstanding Young Optometrist of the Year and has been a member of the Ohio State Board of Optometrists, serving as secretary of the board from 1989-1990 and president from 1990 to 1992. He was Lt. Governor of Zone 4 and Governor of Zone 4 of the Ohio Optometric Association and served on its Board of Directors from 1975 to 1977.

He has volunteered as a medical consultant for the Youngstown Area Community Head Start program and been active in the Foundation for Fighting Blindness.

He has been the president of Tippecanoe Country Club and a member of the American Optometric Association and Epsilon Psi Epsilon National Professional Fraternity. Dr. Gerberry and his wife, Virginia are the parents of four children: Robert '87, Tracy, Jason and Chris. They have five grandchildren.

MOONEY SOCCER STAR PLAYS IN SOCHI



Julie Vazquez, a junior on Mooney's girls' soccer team, was invited to play in the 2014 Kuban Spring international tournament in Sochi, Russia in March. The event was held under the auspices of FIFA, The Fédération Internationale de Football Association, the world soccer governing body. Julie competes on the Region 1 Girls' Olympic Development Program Team, which is recognized as the first step toward making the U.S. National/Olympic Team Pool.

The U.S. Region One Under-17 Team represented the U.S. while competing against Under-19 national teams from Russia, Hungary, Romania, Turkey, Israel, Slovakia, Estonia, Ukraine, Azerbaijan, and the full national team from Iran.

Julie is a three-year varsity letter-winner at Mooney and has been selected for the all-district team since 2011. This past season, she was selected Division III Player of the Year. Julie was named first team All-Ohio as a sophomore and junior. She has scored 77 goals during her three-year career at Mooney and tallied three goals against United in Mooney's 5-1 District Championship victory.

She joined the Olympic Soccer Development Program in 2010, earning a position on the Ohio North Olympic Development Program team each of the past three years and the Pennsylvania West ODP state team this year. In July of 2013, Julie was one of 72 girls nationwide to be named to the Region One ODP squad.

In commenting on her participation in the Olympic Development program, Julie noted that the experience strengthens her skills and prepares her for future competition at the international level. Her ultimate goal is to earn a position on the U.S. National Team roster.

Following her graduation from Cardinal Mooney in 2015, Julie has verbally committed to join the University of Pittsburgh women's soccer team, where the scoring record is held by Mooney alumna Ashley Cuba.

Annual Fund Drive Tops \$80,000



As this edition of the Cardinal Mooney Newsletter was going to press, proceeds thus far for the Annual Fund have topped the \$80,000 mark as of March 15th. The totals lag behind last year's grand total of \$130,000 as of July 1, 2013. In analyzing returns, organizers of the effort are concerned that regular donors to the campaign may be confused by the "quiet campaign" to solicit major gift pledges as a foundation for construction of a new school in southern Mahoning County.

The annual fund effort was established in 1988. \$90,000 of the revenue is budgeted to support existing programs at the school, including scholarships and financial aid that benefit current students. In addition, funds from the Fund, support publication of this newsletter and the school's marketing campaign. Any surplus supports additional projects as designated by the Alumni Board.

The Cardinal Challenge is an important source of revenue for the school. It has been a dependable source of funding for significant programs that benefit our students and has allowed the Alumni Association to undertake new programs as recommended by the school's administration.

CARDINAL MOONEY SPONSORS ROBOTICS TEAM

This year, Cardinal Mooney High School is competing for the first time in the FIRST Robotics Competition. Our team consists of a group of students, teachers and community mentors called the RoboCards. The team is building a robot to enter in the FIRST Robotics Competition, and to promote Science, Technology, Engineering and Math programs at Cardinal Mooney High School.

FIRST, which stands for For Inspiration and Recognition of Science and Technology, is the sponsor of the Robotics Competi-

tion. It was founded by entrepreneur and inventor Dean Kamen, in 1992. It started with a small competition of 28 teams in Manchester, New Hampshire. Since then, it has become an international competition, with teams from 11 countries competing, including teams from Israel, Great Britain, Canada and Brazil. In this program, students are given the opportunity to not only work with engineering mentors, but also to network with thousands of other students from around the world and obtain scholarships from major engineering colleges across the United States

The team competed at the Buckeye Regional Competition on March 20-22 at the Cleveland State University Wolstein Center in Cleveland, Ohio.

As a new club, Mooney received a \$6,000 grant from the National Aeronautics and Space Administration to partially underwrite costs for the start-up program. The Robotics team is still in need of additional support for travel expenses, advertising, building materials, part fabrication, pit crew banners and various other needs. 
Anyone can view the school's gallery at:

Cardinal Mooney High School students join thousands of students from over 130 countries whose artwork is showcased on Artsonia. "This program is a wonderful way to get parents and family members more involved in art education," said Sean Butler.

Fr. DeLucia enlisted the help of the Mooney alumni Ed, George and John Farris at Farris Marketing to go "both ways" and attack both goals. Farris Marketing developed the "Great Futures Start Here" campaign, which included TV, direct mail, database marketing and website updates.

To date, both goals have not only been achieved, they have been surpassed. Not only do the staff and parents feel better about the school, the projected freshman enrollment is up almost 33%.

"Great Futures Start Here" is a two-way winner in my books," said Father DeLucia.



Currently Cardinal Mooney has over 50 artworks displaying the progress of the students (with their parents' permission) through various art classes.

All of Artsonia's artwork (20 million and counting) is viewable online, and any teacher or parent can create an online art gallery for their child or school. Artsonia provides several online features, such as fan clubs and personal guestbooks, as a way for families to encourage the creativity and imaginations of their young artists. In addition, family members can purchase keepsakes imprinted with the child's artwork, with Artsonia donating 20 percent of their annual product revenue back to school art programs. Help Update Cardinal Mooney's Database

Nearly 30 years ago, Cardinal Mooney's Alumni Office researched and established a computerized database of alumni addresses and contact information. With the help of reunion committees, online updates and Biographical Sketch returns, data has been corrected and updated.

Nevertheless, we recognize the need to make a special effort to review the existing database and update and expand the information in our files. One area of particular interest is to update addresses of our younger alumni. Following graduation, they are entered into the alumni records based on their addresses as students.

We depend on the graduates or their parents to update the database when they graduate from college or when they establish a personal residence. The next update is usually at the time of a marriage, when it is hoped that female grads will notify the Alumni Office of a name and address change. In recent years, with the advent of cell phones and email addresses, efforts have been made to expand the data on our records.

Mooney Curriculum Adds New Technology Courses

Cardinal Mooney has taken a step deep into the 21st century with the addition of two new courses that will introduce a Cloud manufacturing program to the curriculum and further develop the school's STEM (science, technology, engineering and math) programs.

Inventor Cloud courses are multidisciplinary, problem- and inquiry-based learning that stimulates student interest. They instill lifelong learning and problem-solving skills essential for career success. Courses integrate rich and relevant course content derived from video, publications, newspapers and other media sources for the Digital classroom.

The new classes will introduce students to the breakthrough technology of Additive Manufacturing according to the standards of NAMII, the National Additive Manufacturing Institute. Students will work on two-dimensional projects that can produce three-dimensional products through the latest in printing technology.

He earned a master's degree from Westminster College and his Ph.D. in political science from the University of Pittsburgh. Mr. Eichenberger spent a total of 49 years in the classroom.

He was named Professor Emeritus in 2002. He dedicated his life to social justice and workers' rights. Mr. Eichenberger was a member of the Midwest Political Science Association. He was an avid reader, loved to golf, but mostly he enjoyed sitting on the patio of his Liberty home, watching his grandchildren play in the backyard.

He is survived by his beloved wife of 54 years, Karen (O'Connell) Eichenberger; children, Susan (Roland Warfield), William, Jane, Kristin (Jason Gay), and Corrinne

Milentijevic; grandchildren, Mark and Elizabeth Levy, Jess and Nora Eichenberger, and Maksim and Jacqueline Milentijevic.

Mr. Joyce was one of Mooney's original faculty members. He joined the staff in 1956 and retired in 1992. During his 36-year career at Mooney, he taught typing, accounting, bookkeeping and business math.

He graduated from South High School in 1948 and earned his degree at Youngstown College. A veteran, he served his country in the U.S. Air Force. He was loved by all who knew him; students and fellow faculty members affectionately referred to the affable Mr. Joyce as "Uncle Harry."

Mr. Joyce was a member of St. Luke Parish, its Holy Name Society, St. Luke's Men's Club, Altar Rosary Society, and the Knights of Columbus.

His wife, the former Dorothy "Dotty" Lucas, whom he married June 17, 1961, passed away in August of 2011.
