

NEW FEDERAL LAW INCREASES MILITARY RECRUITER ACCESS
TO INFORMATION ON SECONDARY SCHOOL STUDENTS

In January of 2002, the President signed into law the "No Child Left Behind Act" which significantly increases a school district's responsibility in releasing student directly information to military recruiters. Effective January 8, 2002, the law requires educational agencies to: "provide on a request made by military recruiters or an institution of higher education, access to secondary school students' names, addresses, and telephone listings".

Parents have an opportunity to have their child's directory information withheld from disclosure. The directory information will be withheld if a student's parent(s) have, prior to the request for the directory information, requested that the information not be released without the parent's written consent.
