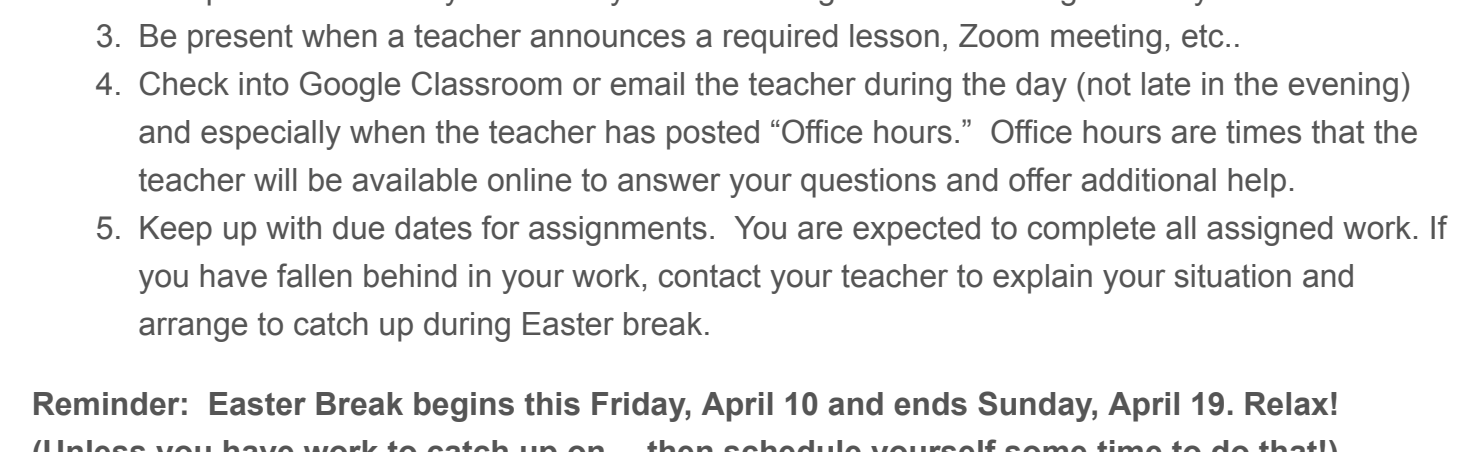

## Academic update

As we enter week 4 of our online classes, let's review what our expectations are for students:

1. Sign into each of your Google Classrooms at least once each day between 9am-3pm to get your daily lesson and/or assignment. You must use your @cardinalmooney.com email.
2. Complete and turn in your work by the deadline given for the assignment by the teacher.
3. Be present when a teacher announces a required lesson, Zoom meeting, etc..
4. Check into Google Classroom or email the teacher during the day (not late in the evening) and especially when the teacher has posted "Office hours." Office hours are times that the teacher will be available online to answer your questions and offer additional help.
5. Keep up with due dates for assignments. You are expected to complete all assigned work. If you have fallen behind in your work, contact your teacher to explain your situation and arrange to catch up during Easter break.

**Reminder: Easter Break begins this Friday, April 10 and ends Sunday, April 19. Relax! (Unless you have work to catch up on....then schedule yourself some time to do that!)**

The main office will be open on Tuesday, April 7, from 11am-1pm for these services:

1. Pick up books, class materials, ChromeBook, etc. if needed. Let your teacher know so we can get the items ready!
2. Turn in registration and tuition intent forms.
3. Turn in EdChoice applications and materials--Be sure to read through the updated information about how to apply now.
4. Turn in application materials for financial aid or scholarships from the Diocese or CMHS.
5. Registration for new students by appointment through pkalasky@youngstowndiocese.org (9am-2pm)

**Come to the main office door. Social distancing will be observed and one person at a time will be admitted into the office. For everyone's safety, we cannot allow for trips to lockers, etc. at this time.**

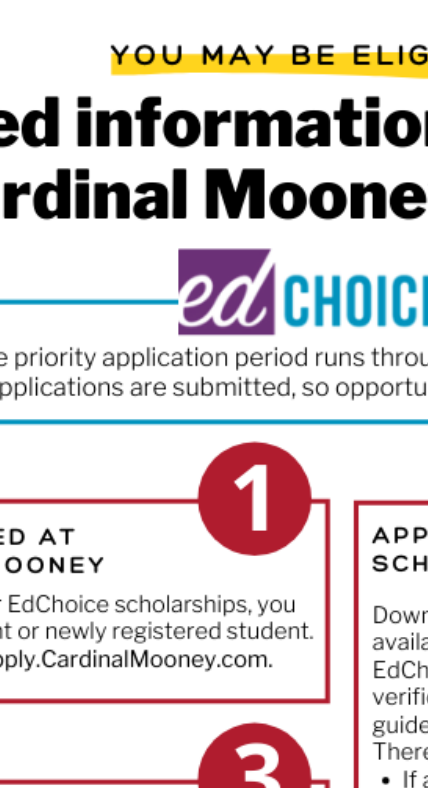

Download and complete the application form available here to renew or request a new EdChoice Scholarship. Include income verification if your family meets low income guidelines.

There are two choices:

- If a new student, apply for new EdChoice Scholarship if your home high school is on the designated lists for 2019-20 AND 2020-21
- Consider EdChoice Expansion if your student is now in grades 8-11, attending or registered for next year at CMHS, and your family meets the low income guidelines, but your district's high school is not on the lists.
