

We embrace our past as we forge into the future

Dear Cardinal Mooney Family:

It was nice for me to meet several of you this past week as you returned to school to close out the academic year. I'm looking forward to meeting all of you upon your return in August.

I also took time to wander the campus, which struck me as the embodiment of the kind of dynamic community I and Dr. Beiting will be developing here. It pays homage to the great traditions like the Victory Bell, and presents our proud history in pictures on the walls. It has also been renovated for the 21st century without being bound by the past.

My office is on the second floor, so each day I pass the portrait of Cardinal Edward Mooney. Naturally I wanted to learn something of him. To my surprise, the Maj family and Cardinal Mooney High School have something in common. Cathedral Latin High School in Cleveland, where my father graduated from, was "organized and led" by then Fr. Mooney. Most importantly, his biography provides spiritual direction to our school — then and now: "He took as his Cardinal's motto the expression "Domino Servientes" — Serving the Lord, which expressed his deepest convictions on behalf of justice and educational opportunity (From Eminence, the Silver Jubilee)." Justice and educational opportunity have been the hallmark of a Mooney education, and will be a trusted reminder as I lead Cardinal Mooney.

A reminder of our covenant with our families and alumni to provide quality Catholic education in service of our Church and community.

By any measure, by any meaning, these are interesting times. COVID has altered how we live and conduct our businesses. It hardly seems there is a single entity not affected or not facing unprecedented challenges. Meanwhile, the nature of what is expected of us, or what we're capable of delivering, also presents challenges. Making sense of the world we live in is difficult, yet I will argue that what this moment demands from all of us is simply the best we have to give. What this moment demands of Cardinal Mooney is to exercise its power as an institution for good and progress ... and as a beacon of hope to our children and community.

Sadly I've already heard the chatter about Mooney closing. ***It is not!*** In fact, I will tell you that there has never been a more important time for this most important institution — ***justice and educational opportunity***. All around us is doubt and uncertainty ... doubt in the economy, uncertainty in our ability to overcome COVID, and doubt about our future. People are questioning institutions and each other.

I understand all of that and have this to offer: Mooney's contributions become more vital not less in this environment. Mooney is valued because it has values. We teach the hard sciences but also the arts and humanities because those are what make us human.

As I greeted students and was greeted by them this past week, I saw in them hope. That hope — their hope — radiates out from this place and touches people who may never sit in our desks. That is "***Justice***" lived out.

Hope radiates from Cardinal Mooney and the work our faculty and staff do each day — "educational opportunity."

As I wandered the halls and campus I saw what a Mooney education offers: It offers a treasured glimpse into our human core in literature and history classes; in the art, speech, and music class it opens windows to creativity. But most importantly, it provides new truths for students who come to us likely never having seen discovery with their own eyes — ***justice and educational opportunity***.

This is not the time for students' education to be interrupted, or to misinterpret the role of Catholic education — a Mooney education.

From Silver Jubilee, Eminence, we read: "... Cardinal Edward Mooney's sensitivity to the social justice calls of the Gospel endeared him to the suffering working class families who made up his community." As I look at the horizon ahead of me, I know that Cardinal Mooney High School has the capacity to lead. My hope is that you will join me in making Cardinal Mooney a vibrant Catholic school community.




BISHOP GEORGE MURRY

Dear Parents, Guardians, and Students,

Thanks to all who participated in last week's days to return books and Chromebooks and to pick up the items left in each student's locker. If you were not able to complete the exchange last week, please be sure to come this week and bring in the books, Chromebook, and other materials that your student used during the time classes were online. All of those materials were on loan to the student and must be returned to the school so we can account for them and put them into service again for the next school year. - Summer office hours begin on Monday, June 8. The office will be open from 8 a.m. until 2 p.m. every Monday-Thursday through the rest of June and all of July. The office will be closed on Fridays in June and July. Please wear a mask when you come to visit the office.

- Please be sure that you have submitted both the schedule request form and the tuition intent form so that we may include your student's request as we work on the schedule. Athletes can start training under these guidelines

Dear Mooney Student Athletes and Families,

The OHSA has allowed for the opening up of skill instruction and conditioning. As stated in the bulletin last week, coaches began these sessions on June 1. The sessions are voluntary, not mandatory. Please read the link to the OHSA documents included with this letter so that you are familiar with what the expectations are.

There are three phases to the guidelines, with each one lasting two weeks, helping the student athletes and coaches safely ramp up their conditioning while minimizing the chance of spreading the virus. Our coaches agree with the gradual re-start for the students. We understand that this is a time to go slowly so that we can successfully progress to Phase Two after 2 weeks and finally to Phase Three after another 2 weeks. A parent/guardian and athlete must sign the **consent form** that is included.

Phase One only allows for a group of ten people to be together at one time to begin conditioning. **The ten include the coach(es) and athletes who will work and stay together in each group (or "pod") during these first two weeks.** Exercising with the same people helps reduce the chance of spreading any disease. Social distancing and good sanitation will be important.

Each athlete must come dressed for the workout, wearing shirts and shoes, with a mask, with his/her own water bottle clearly labeled and not shared with anyone, and shower at home after the workout. No locker rooms will be open. When a group is done, they are to leave and not hang out to watch others or to socialize in the parking lot.

There is a strict protocol for each session that requires a **daily health check** and that must be documented for an athlete's participation in any session. It will involve a temperature check, and verification that there is no fever, cough, sore throat, shortness of breath, or contact with COVID-19. If an athlete or coach is ill, he or she must stay home. No vulnerable person may participate in Phase One.

Consent and Waiver of All Claims

This Consent and Waiver of All Claims concerns the participation of _____ ("Student") in any and all athletic activities ("Athletic Activities") associated with Cardinal Mooney High School ("School").

Athletic Activities by their very nature involve the risk of personal injury and serious harm including death as well as potential exposure to and illness from infectious and/or communicable diseases, including but not limited to COVID-19, MRSA, influenza, and other infectious and/or communicable diseases, and other risks that are not known or not reasonably foreseeable (collectively "Risks").

In conducting Athletic Activities, the School will comply with Ohio law, the mandatory rules and regulations promulgated by the Ohio High School Athletic Association, and the mandatory guidelines issued by the Ohio Department of Health, and such other rules and regulations which may be implemented by the School (collectively "Rules and Regulations").

By signing below the Student and, if the Student is under 18 years of age, the Student's parent or legal guardian ("Parent/Guardian"), do hereby consent, acknowledge, and agree as follows: (1) that the Student's participation in the Athletic Activities is voluntary; (2) the Student's participation in the Athletic Activities exposes the Student to the Risks and the Student and the Parent/Guardian do hereby knowingly and voluntarily assume the Risks by participating in the Athletic Activities including but not limited to possible exposure to and/or infection with COVID-19 and do hereby accept sole responsibility for any injury to the Student and the Parent/Guardian including but not limited to personal injury, illness, death, and other losses; (3) that if the Student has underlying health concerns which may place the Student at greater risk of contracting COVID-19 or that would possibly increase the severity of illness if COVID-19 is contracted, that the Student and the Parent/Guardian will consult with the Student's health care professional before the Student's participation in the Athletic Activities; (4) that the Student and the Parent/Guardian will comply with the Rules and Regulations; (5) that while adherence to the Rules and Regulations may reduce possible exposure to the Risks (including COVID-19), the possibility of serious illness and death remains; (6) that the Student's exposure to the Risks may result from the actions, omissions, or negligence of the undersigned and others, including but not limited to, employees and volunteers of the School, as well as other participants in the Athletic Activities and/or their family members; and (7) that there is no guarantee that the Student and the Parent/Guardian will not become infected with COVID-19.

By signing below, the Parent/Guardian on behalf of the Parent/Guardian and the Student (or if the Student is 18 years of age or older, the Student on behalf of the Student), do hereby release, covenant not to sue, discharge and hold harmless the School, the Diocese of Youngstown, the Bishop of the Diocese of Youngstown, the Administrator of the Diocese of Youngstown (if any), and their respective officers, directors, servants, agents, employees, affiliates, coaches, contractors, volunteers, successors and assigns, from and against any and all claims, demands, damages, injuries, losses, actions or causes of action, at law or equity, on account of or relating to any act or omission by the School and the Diocese of Youngstown, and their respective officers, directors, servants, agents, employees, affiliates, coaches, contractors, volunteers, successors and assigns, arising now or in the future which may be sustained by the Student and/or the Parent/Guardian as a result of the Student's participation in the Athletic Activities and the use of the facilities and equipment relating to the School.


