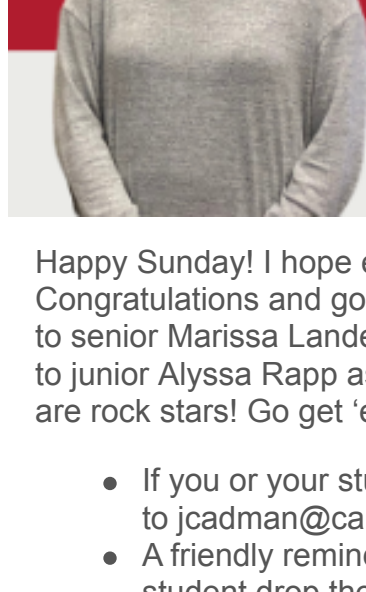
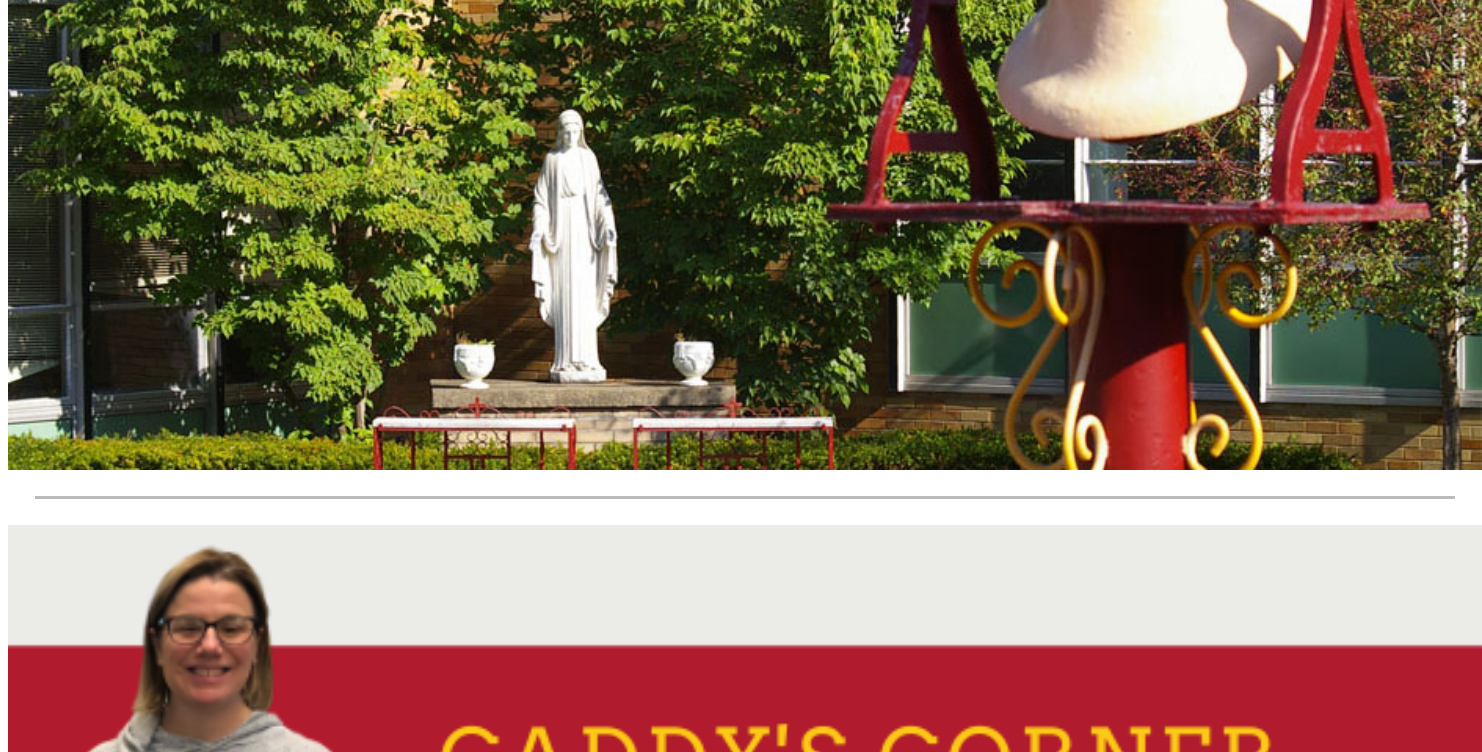

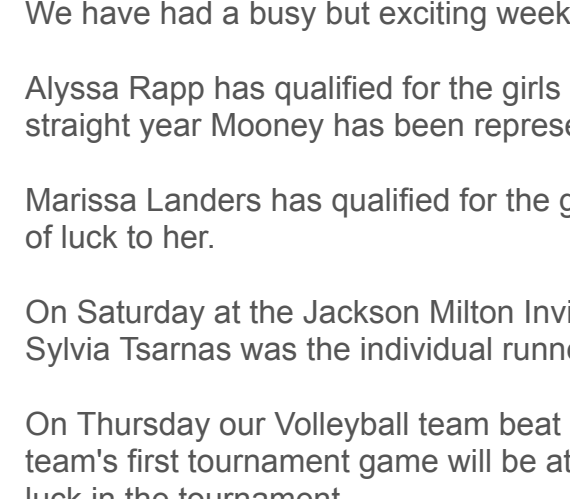
Please read this note from Assistant Principal, Matthew Monter:

Dear Mooney Family,

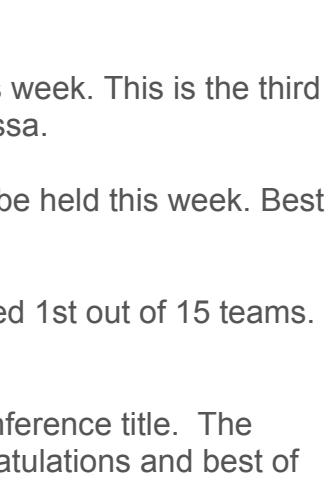
Last Thursday, students received their student ID cards. These cards should be used when going through the lunch line so that we are able to inventory lunch items chosen. A student can use the ID card to pay for items that were not included in the daily free lunch. When you add funds to the student's account through the business office, this ID card is the "debit" card for payment. If a student loses the ID card, he/she should see Mr. Monter. There will be a \$10 fee for a replacement card.

The students also received a lock for their lockers. The lock is to be used on the locker that was assigned to the student. Students may not share lockers. Lockers were assigned by odd or even numbers in a given hallway to allow for social distancing. The students were reminded that backpacks are now to be left in the lockers during the school day.

It is the student's responsibility to return the same lock at the end of the school year. There will be a \$10 fee for any lock not returned. Any questions or issues with locks or lockers should be directed to Mr. Monter.

School notes

WEEKEND MEALS AVAILABLE: Starting on Friday, Oct. 16, students will be eligible to take home two breakfasts and two lunches for the weekend. These packaged meals will be free and come with milk. The National School lunch program will offer this every Friday for the rest of the year. Students must sign up for their weekend meal at Thursday's lunch period. Meals will be distributed from the cafeteria at dismissal on Fridays. Ken Stabilein of AVI Food Service will be walking table to table on Tuesday to answer students questions regarding our meal programs.

THE NATIONAL SCHOOL LUNCH PROGRAM is temporarily offering students free meals. According to the USDA, students will have meals as late as October 31, 2020, until funding runs out to help children have access to nutritious food as the country recovers from the COVID-19 pandemic.

Free and Reduced School Meal Applications are available on our website for the 2020-2021 school year. We encourage all eligible families to fill out the application in order to be ready to resume the Free and Reduced School Lunch program in January 2021 and for other qualifying purposes.

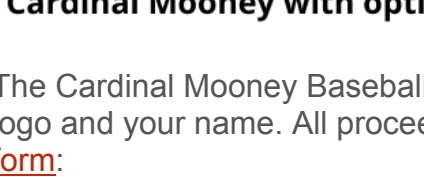
WRTA: All rides are free, but masks are required. Call (330)941-5789 for more information about the route.
