



To avoid despair, we must look to Mary for grace through these uncertain times

Dear Parents:

Last Sunday in union with the whole Church, we celebrated the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. This is the feast day when Mary - after accompanying Jesus from Bethlehem to the cross - joined her Son in heaven. Our statue of Mary is a daily reminder that She is a full participant in our salvation and Her presence with us shows us we can walk our path with confidence. Without a doubt, Friday's news of our temporary return to masks, took wind out of our sails. The presence of the delta variant is daunting. I understand and appreciate giving in to impulses that come with a wide range of emotions. While we must keep those firmly in our minds, we cannot allow them to paralyze us. We cannot allow this moment to beget a loss of confidence in our work. We will open tomorrow with a passionate intensity to address our challenges but also to go far beyond meeting immediate needs as we continue to leverage this time for Mooney's long-term advantage.

I was as hopeful as any that we would be "mask free" yet I'd like to offer a different view from both those in favor AND opposed to the decision. I welcome different perspectives. I don't know that things need to be personal, but they need to be honest. And honesty is one of the Mooney Family's greatest and most abiding strengths. Contrary to many outside our school, church, and community we tend to be far more willing to examine our beliefs and our first principles in search of solutions.

It's going to take a while to sort through this mess called COVID. There's evidence and experts for every position and/or permutation of "science," There will be those who will cling to their positions and those who use theirs as a club in the battle for dominance of who is right. And, much of the instant analysis (mine included) is bound to be proven wrong in the coming days, weeks, and months. My only real counsel is against despair and cynicism. Look to Mary for optimism. She always saw hope when there was ample reason to despair. We are all tired of COVID, mandates, and the uncertainty of what will be next. We should also be tired of cynicism. The crucifix demands a different response from us.

I've been making the case for what makes a Catholic school different and vital. Last spring when addressing the Class of '21 Looted that Catholic education is a



In this moment both terribly difficult and rife with possibility, Cardinal Mooney has the distinct and pivotal role of revitalizing our community, our civil dialogue, and our human relationships for the long-term.

But Mooney can't do it alone. Succeeding will require all of us to free ourselves from parochial interests and territorial claims, to reject hardened attitudes, and to ensure that we fully prepare our students for leadership in a global context.

We must show them hope, resilience, and give them the tools to work through challenging times. We must also guard against despair, for it is the gateway drug to cynicism and indifference. Our societal problems are too great, and our mission too just for cynicism to take


heavy cross. It is blessed only in the sense that the cross is blessed – and that it gives us the heavy opportunity to do our duty.

In sending your sons and daughters to Mooney you understand that our students are exposed to a culture antithetical to faith and increasingly to reason as well. Our students are asked to account for the past, present, and future - to reconcile the mercy of Christ with the horrors of the world, and to be perfect in an imperfect

A conversation I had with two recent grads about current events in Afghanistan further solidified certain thoughts I've surmised about our students - and young people in general, I think: The anomalies in their lives overwhelm them. Yet, because both of these recent grads learned of the greatest primal anomaly – that God sent His own Son to earth to be crucified — they are more prepared to go out into the world and find solutions rather than give into cynicism.

I'm certain we will face many in our community who question the relevance of Catholic education. Others will relish in the schadenfreude of the decision to return to masks. In an age so afflicted by its own failures, and by the manifest shortcomings of a culture that seems to have successfully created self-disgust, we all can draw on the special reserves of Christianity: patience, selfdenial, understanding, faith, joy, and hope. This is why you send your sons and daughters to Cardinal Mooney. It was great to see a student section at the game Friday night, and our student-athletes in competition both Friday and Saturday. I'm excited for them to meet our newest - and very talented and passionate - faculty members: Mr. Andre Repucci, Ms. Lisa Jones, counselors Ms. Kelly Barley and Ms. Sierra Billhimer, and Mr David Paiae.

Tomorrow starts another year, but don't you worry, you have nothing to fear.





Instructions for the Youngstown City School Bus Transportation

The Versatrans E-Link Parent Portal allows parents to look up the student's bus assignment information. Instructions are as follows:

- · Go to the Youngstown City Schools website (ycsd.org)
- · On the left side, click on "Transportation."
- . Click on E-Link Parent Portal to begin the log in. It will ask for the following:
 - Username = jane.smith (that is jane dot smith with no spaces). You would enter your student's first name dot last name.
 - Password is the student's date of birth = If your child's birthdate is Jan. 1, 2014, it
 would become 01012014 (passwords are 2 digit month, 2 digit day and four digit
 year). There are no spaces, periods or slashes between the month, date and year.
- This will bring you to Versatrans e-Link Online Information System. Once on this page, click on "Work with Students."
- On the next screen, click on School/Transportation Search and enter the requested information and click on School/Transportation Information.
- The next screen you will see will give you all the pertinent information such as location, time of pick-up and time of drop-off.

Please have your student carry his/her lunch pass (which will serve as their temporary ID) in case there are any questions/concerns from the bus transportation service.

We are extremely excited about offering this service to our students and ask for your patience as we get this program up and running. Over the course of the next week or two, please inform the office if you are using this transportation method so that we can update the list. If you are having trouble logging into the account, please feel free to contact Mrs. Kalasky at 330-788-5007 ext. 162.



CAFETERIA NOTES

Dear Parents, Guardians and Students:

Cardinal Mooney will again be able to offer breakfast and lunch meals to all students ABSOLUTELY FREE for the entire 2021-2022 school year. For a meal to qualify as free, please remember these simple rules:

For Breakfast

Your breakfast selection may include a hot entrée or a pastry, granola bar or bagel. Additionally, you must take either fruit or juice. You MAY take two fruits (one may be a juice), and a milk.

For Lunch

Your lunch selection includes the hot entrée offered on that menu day, or an alterative, such as a variety of salads, sandwiches, pizza or pepperoni rolls.

Additionally, you must take either a fruit, a vegetable, or a milk. You MAY take two fruits, two vegetables, and a milk.

Additional items will be available, such as extra entrées, French fries, cookies, chips and beverages. These can be purchased with cash, or by prepaid funding of your student cafeteria account. Prefunding of student accounts can be done by sending cash or check to the cafeteria, or online at PaySchoolsCentral.com. Every student has received their barcode and student ID number (this is a temporary card, students will receive their permanent ID's after picture day). These cards are needed when setting up your son or daughters pay schools account. As every student is able to receive free meals, charging of additional items to account is only allowable if there are sufficient funds to cover the purchase.

Students, to make mealtime lines move quickly and provide adequate time to eat, please have your student ID number or barcode with you. Please note that photos on phones of these cards do work on the cafeteria scanners.
