Criteria for Nomination to the Hall of Fame

I. The nominee, if an alumnus/alumna, must have graduated at least fifteen years ago (class of 2004 or earlier).

II. The nominee must qualify in one of the following categories:

- 1. Any person who distinguished himself/herself in athletics while a student at Cardinal Mooney High School.
- 2. Any person who distinguished himself/herself in athletics after graduation from Cardinal Mooney High School.
- 3. Any presently inactive coach who has made a significant contribution to the athletic program at Cardinal Mooney High School.
- 4. Any person who contributed significantly to the Cardinal Mooney athletic program.

Inductees can be nominated either:

- 1. By the selection committee or
- 2. By an alumnus (a) (the nomination form usually appears in an issue of the alumni newsletter.)

This year the selection committee chose the inductees from a group of 73 nominees whose names were submitted



Robert Babyak

Class of '70 | Significant Contributions



Robert Babyak, a distinguished alumnus of Cardinal Mooney High School, has led a remarkable life marked by his achievements in academics, athletics, and community service. Babyak graduated from Cardinal Mooney High School in 1970, leaving an indelible mark on the school's sports legacy.

During his high school years, Babyak demonstrated exceptional athleticism by earning varsity letters in multiple sports. He received letters in freshman football, sophomore football, and sophomore tennis. Throughout his junior and senior years, Babyak continued to excel in football and tennis, serving as a football captain during his senior season. His dedication to sportsmanship and leadership both on and off the field laid the foundation for a lifelong commitment to his alma mater.

After graduation, Babyak played a key role in revitalizing the athletic booster club at Cardinal Mooney. Over eight years as the Booster Club Chairman, he focused on fundraising efforts that significantly benefited CMHS athletics. His contributions extended to organizing important events like the booster club reverse raffle dinner and the lottery. Babyak's commitment to building a strong athletic community was evident through his involvement in the parochial track meet, managing concession stands, and supporting basketball games.

Academically, Babyak pursued a Bachelor of Science in Business Administration with a major in accounting and economics at Youngstown State University, graduating in 1975. In 1976, he married his high school sweetheart, Paulette Tkacik, and they raised two sons, Michael and Mark, who are both graduates of Cardinal Mooney High School.

Professionally, Babyak gained extensive experience in various roles, including auditing for Lykes Corporation/LTV from 1975 to 1980 and managing cost accounting at Cold Metal Products from 1980 to 1982. He later served as a supply chain manager for RMI Titanium/RTI/Arconic/Howmet from 1982 to 2017.

In addition to his professional and community involvement, Babyak prioritized family, cherishing his role as a grandfather to three granddaughters: Aubrey, Emma, and Isla Babyak. He remains an active member of the Mill Creek Senior Gold League and Reserve Run Invitational Golf League, showcasing his enduring passion for sports and community engagement.

Babyak's dedication to excellence and service was officially recognized in 2018 when he was honored as a Cardinal Mooney High School Distinguished Alumnus. Today, he continues to give back to the community as an OHSAA and Collegiate track and field official, leaving a lasting legacy of leadership, commitment, and service to Cardinal Mooney High School.

Amber Bodrick

Class of '05 | Basketball



Amber Bodrick left an indelible mark on the basketball court throughout her career. Let's delve into her journey. As a senior at Cardinal Mooney High School, Bodrick was a force to be reckoned with. She led her team to a District runner-up finish, showcasing her exceptional skills. Averaging 25 points, 17 rebounds, and 3 assists, Bodrick dominated the game.

Her high school accolades include three consecutive 1st team All-Steel Valley Conference honors and two-time selection to the All-NEO team. She twice earned a spot on the Associated Press Division III All-Ohio team. Notably, Bodrick surpassed the 1,000 career points milestone and set a Division III tournament record with 38 points against Columbiana High School. Her 1053 career points made her the fourth player in school history to eclipse the 1000 point mark. Finally, her 484 points as a senior left her tied for the most points in a season.

Amber Bodrick continued her basketball journey at Thiel College. As a freshman, she made history by scoring 535 points in 26 games—the highest by any freshman in Thiel's program. Over her college career, she tallied 1,867 points, securing the second-highest position in school history. Bodrick's 733 field goals remain unmatched in the program's annals, while her 326 free throws rank second. Her impact extended beyond scoring: she excelled in rebounds, blocks, steals, assists, and three-pointers.
