Where: CMHS auditorium or gymnasium (instructions will be provided at a later date)

Who: All Sophomores
What: PreACT Test
Why: Students will

- Expose themselves to a practice test designed to get a feel for the ACT.
- Assess academic strengths and areas for improvement.
- Familiarize themselves with the test format, practice time management, and gain insight into their potential performance on the actual ACT.
- Allows them to make informed decisions about study strategies and future testing plans.

ACT

When: Tuesday, Feb. 25

Where: CMHS auditorium or gymnasium (instructions will be provided at a later date)

Who: All Juniors What: ACT Test Why: Students:

- Can use this free test as a reportable score to colleges/universities
- Students' readiness for college-level work will be evaluated through this standardized college admissions test that is used by many universities across the U.S.
- Will be tested on four main subjects: English, math, reading, and science
- Will use test scores help colleges assess academic skills and determine eligibility for admission, scholarships, and other academic opportunities

 Take the ACT as a key step in the college application process, helping students showcase their abilities to prospective schools

IOWA TESTING

All Cardinal Mooney students must pass the IOWA Assessment with a minimum total score of 255 on the two mathematics sections and 249 on the three English Language Arts sections.

The assessment is used for the Ohio graduation requirements and to renew eligibility for students who are on EdChoice and The Jon Peterson Scholarship.

Students who needed to retake the IOWA were tested on December 3rd and 4th. A letter will be mailed home with their results next week.
