Criteria for Nomination to the Hall of Fame

I. The nominee, if an alumnus/alumna, must have graduated at least fifteen years ago

II. The nominee must qualify in one of the following categories:

1. Any person who distinguished himself/herself in athletics while a student at Cardinal Mooney High School.
2. Any person who distinguished himself/herself in athletics after graduation from Cardinal Mooney High School.
3. Any presently inactive coach who has made a significant contribution to the athletic program at Cardinal Mooney High School.
4. Any person who contributed significantly to the Cardinal Mooney athletic program.

Inductees can be nominated either:

1. By the selection committee or
2. By an alumnus (a) (the nomination form usually appears in an issue of the alumni newsletter.)

Class of '09 | Soccer



Ashley (Cuba) Buchta, an alumnus of Cardinal Mooney High School, has led a remarkable life marked by her achievements in academics, athletics, and community service. Ashley graduated from Cardinal Mooney High School in 2009, leaving an indelible mark on the school's sports legacy.

During her high school years, Ashley demonstrated exceptional athleticism on the soccer field by leading her team to 3 straight district championships. Ashley received all SVC first team honors, all county first team honors, and all district first team honors for three consecutive seasons. She was named District Player of the year for three consecutive years as well. Her accolades don't stop there. Ashley was recognized as first team all Ohio throughout her high school career. She is an NSCAA All American, and has played on the Adidas U.S. All Region Team. In her senior season, she was ESPN National Player of the Week, and Ohio Division 2 Player of the Year. Her dedication to the sport of soccer, and leadership both on and off the field laid the foundation for a very bright future.

After graduation, Ashley's soccer journey did not end. Ashley went on to play at the University of Pittsburgh, where she held a 10 year record for most career goals (23). She has other numerous records including career points, goals per game, and game winning goals in a season. She was named to the All Big East Rookie Team in 2009. She was named to the All Big East Third Team, and was Pitt's first ever Athlete of the Week. Ashley was a part of the first Pitt women's soccer team to qualify for the post season tournament.

After leaving Pitt, Ashley signed a professional contract with Kokkola Futsal 10 in Finland. In 2014, she was rostered on the Washington Spirit Reserves. In 2019, Ashley played at the Premier Arena Soccer League National Championships with the Youngstown Nighthawks. Within 3 games, she had 10 goals. She then went on to play for the FC Barracudas in Pittsburgh, and also played for the Fayetteville Fury. Ashley's impressive soccer resume concludes with an invitation to the United States Mini Futbol World Cup try-outs where she was selected as an alternate for the team. Ashley's commitment to building a strong athletic community was evident through her involvement in soccer camps and volunteer coaching with both the University of Pittsburgh, and the Fayetteville Fury.

Academically, Ashley pursued a Bachelor of Arts in Anthropology from the University of Pittsburgh. In 2021, Ashley returned back to Youngstown State to pursue her Masters in Criminal Justice, the same year she married Zeke Buchta. She now works for the Department of Justice as a Federal Bureau of Investigation Special Agent. Her roles include working to end violent crimes against children, she is a school liaison, and is also a member of crisis negotiation teams, and evidence response teams. She currently gives back to the community by taking part in Shop with a Cop where she takes underprivileged children Christmas shopping.

Significant Contributions



It is without hesitation to say that athleticism, athletic prowess and victory are the vital components for induction into an athletic hall of fame. However, the gentleman, teacher, and administrator, whom thousands of Cardinal Mooney graduates continue to applaud, also represents a vital component to their achievement and success because he practiced, enforced, and maintained discipline for many student athletes and their cheering squads for more than 46 years.

Jim, "the long arm of the law" graduated from Ursuline High School in 1957 and then attended The Athenaeum of Ohio in Cincinnati, where he earned a Bachelor's degree. He went on to Xavier University to receive a Master's Degree in Education. Returning to the Youngstown Diocese in 1964, Jim was hired by Cardinal Mooney on September 2, 1964. Mr. Cooney served 46 years with the Mooney family as a religion, geometry, and calculus instructor until 1971. He then assumed the administrative positions of Dean of Students and then the Assistant Principal in charge of discipline, until retirement in June of 2010. Jim's near perfect attendance in the classroom, in addition to baccalaureates and graduations, banquets, and fundraisers for over 4 decades is a testament to his dedication and commitment to Catholic education.

As our teams continued to move on in state competition, (as they generally did), he was again responsible for overseeing and monitoring the discipline of the student body to assure its positive reputation.

Presently Jim resides in Poland where he is a member of Holy Family Church. He is married to the former May Ann Mandl. And, yes, "Cooney" can still free handedly draw a perfect circle!

Michael again served as team captain and earned First Team All-SVC and First Team All-District honors. His love for the game was evident, inspiring future generations of soccer players.

Her 1992 championship team was later featured in John Carroll University's "Celebrating 100 Years of JCU Athletics" article in May 2020.

Beyond athletics, Nashe was a radio DJ for WJCU and served as vice president of the Black Student Union before earning her J.D. from Cleveland-Marshall College of Law at Cleveland State University. She went on to serve as CEO of the Nashe Law Group, LLC, co-founder of Innertainment Delivery Systems, LLC, and principal of MaxxContent, LLC, a leading e-learning and content distributor for the corrections industry. She hosts The Phylanice Nashe Experience Podcast, where she interviews entrepreneurs and business leaders on navigating challenges as Black professionals.

Taylor Hill, a name that all Cardinal Mooney football fans recognize, is no stranger to success. Taylor was an integral member of the 2006 Cardinal Mooney State Championship team, and his legacy continues to inspire those who follow.

Taylor quickly became a standout player. His career included 3 state championship appearances in 2005, 2006, and 2007, finishing with an impressive overall record of 40-4. As a team, they won 28 consecutive games in his junior and senior seasons.

As a junior, Taylor's leadership qualities were evident, and he earned spots on the Honorable Mention All-Ohio, All-SVC, and All-County teams. His senior year saw him elevate his game even further. Taylor finished his career with 206 tackles and 18.5 sacks. He was named All-SVC, All-County, and First Team All-Ohio. He was also considered a 4-star prospect as a linebacker, receiving numerous D1 scholarship offers, including Oklahoma and Michigan.

Post high school, Taylor attended Michigan University before transferring to Youngstown State University, where he became a key member of the football team. As a freshman, he earned a spot on the Missouri Valley Football Conference's All-Newcomer Team, starting all 11 games as an outside linebacker. He led the team with 65 tackles, becoming the first freshman to lead the team in total stops since 1985. In his sophomore season, Taylor was named Defensive Player of the Week and Special Teams Player of the Week.

Since Cardinal Mooney, Taylor has completed a 4 year program to become a Union Carpenter. He then worked as a Union Carpenter for 15 years. Taylor has since started his own property management company. He is currently married to his high school sweetheart, Chakia Howell, and they have 3 children: Chakya, Taylor Jr., and Kylor. Taylor's passion for the game continues to shine, and his success both on and off the field serves as a model for the athletes who follow.



Joe Irwin

Class of '05 | Baseball



JDetermination and adaptability powered Joe Irwin through high school baseball, traits that continued to serve him well as he advanced through the college ranks.

As a freshman at Cardinal Mooney, Irwin earned a varsity letter and quickly established himself as a player to watch. By his sophomore year, he played a crucial role in helping the program capture a Steel Valley Conference championship, boasting an impressive .364 batting average with a .538 on-base percentage.

Irwin's junior season was filled with clutch performances. He took the mound in the sectional championship, delivering both at the plate and on the field—recording three hits, driving in two runs, and allowing only two hits against top-seeded United Local. In the district semifinals, he struck out 10 batters to secure a 3-2 victory over Ursuline. Facing ACC, he dominated early, striking out seven of the first nine batters. His standout performances earned him First Team All-SVC and First Team All-District honors.

As a senior, Irwin led Cardinal Mooney to an 18-3 record and was instrumental in postseason victories. In the sectional final, he carried a no-hitter into the seventh inning of a 5-1 win over LaBrae, finishing with 10 strikeouts and two doubles. He followed up with a complete-game victory in the regional semifinals, guiding his team to a 6-3 win. He capped off his high school career with First Team All-SVC and First Team All-District honors, finishing the season with a .406 batting average, an 8-2 pitching record, and an average of 10 strikeouts per game.

Irwin continued his baseball career at Wallace State Junior College from 2006 to 2007 before transferring to Mount Union, where he played from 2008 to 2010. He helped lead the team to a 12-4 record and recorded 156 strikeouts over his collegiate career. He graduated in 2010 with a degree in business administration.

Now part of the sales team at Compco Industries, Irwin values time with his wife, Jessica, and their two children, Hank and Nora. His journey from high school standout to college athlete and dedicated family man showcases the power of perseverance and passion for the game.



Tim Marlowe

Class of '08 | Football



.Tim Marlowe, a three-sport athlete and state champion, made a lasting impact at Cardinal Mooney High School through his dedication and leadership.

As a freshman, Marlowe helped lead his team to a 9-0 record, scoring seven touchdowns. His strong work ethic earned him varsity minutes on special teams as a sophomore. His junior season was a standout year as he started at wide receiver for the 14-0 state championship football team, recording five catches for 130 yards and two touchdowns. He also started as the point guard for the basketball team and played center field for the baseball team.

In his senior season, Marlowe played in 12 games at wide receiver, finishing with nine catches for 216 yards and three touchdowns. He also made three appearances at quarterback, throwing for 157 yards and three touchdowns. On the ground, he had 42 carries for 298 yards and four touchdowns. Defensively, he played 15 games at cornerback, recording 36 tackles, 32 pass deflections, five interceptions, and a fumble recovery. On special teams, he had 12 punt returns for 302 yards, including a punt return touchdown in the regional final against Steubenville. Marlowe and his teammates finished as state runners-up with a 14-1 record.

He earned First Team All-SVC, First Team All-NEO, and First Team All-State honors. His talents extended beyond football—he batted .414 with a .500 on-base percentage in baseball, leading the state with 38 stolen bases, a single-season record at Mooney. He helped the team reach the district final.

Marlowe continued his football career on a full scholarship at Nebraska under coach Bo Pelini. As a freshman in 2008, he was named Offensive Scout Team MVP. Over the next two seasons, he played on special teams and was nationally ranked on the kickoff return unit. In 2011, he started at wide receiver and special teams, recording 12 catches for 113 yards and a touchdown. In 2012, he helped lead Nebraska to the Big Ten Championship Game, finishing his collegiate career with 1,101 all-purpose yards. He was a two-time Nebraska Honor Roll student-athlete and earned a degree in communication studies. He later spent two years as a graduate assistant at Nebraska.

Marlowe met his wife, Kirsten, at Nebraska. They have three children—Timmy, Nolan, and Collins. He now works for his family's business, Marlowe's Premium Coffee, in Youngstown. After returning home, he spent five years coaching at Youngstown State University, contributing to the 2016 FCS national runner-up team.
